In our newsletter I will continue to focus on preparation for college. You and your student have a variety of resources at North that can really help in your college search process. One of those tools is

Naviance.

Naviance is a powerful college search engine, and organizer of information for your student. Our students can research colleges, submit applications, create a resume, gather teacher letters of recommendation, view a calendar of upcoming college visits, all on Naviance. Ask your student to show you how. If you have questions on how to access Naviance, or the services available, your link to college and careers is your student's school counselor.

<u>College Representative Visits:</u> Colleges want your student! We have a huge number of colleges that visit us to talk to our students. This week Marquette, Loyola, UW Lacrosse, Millikin University, St. Ambrose, Illinois College, and UW Stevens Point are all on campus. During the month of September 24 different colleges and universities will be at North. Students can sign up to attend a session on *Naviance*.

<u>Schedule a College Visit:</u> Before you buy a car, you test drive it, compare it against other models, check out the engine, talk to family and friends. College is one of the biggest investments you and your student will make. Treat it like a car purchase. Columbus Day, October 10, is a day off school and a huge college visit day. Make sure you register in advance at the college. Consider taking your student on a visit. A few upcoming visit days:

Student Attendance

On days when your student must be absent from school, please do the following:

Call the Attendance Office at 630-653-9092 prior to 10:00am each day that the student is absent. This number is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Remember that the Illinois School Code only permits a student to be absent from school due to **illness**, observance of **religious holidays**, death in the immediate family, or family **emergencies**.

FirstView Bus Tracking App:

In continued partnership with our transportation provider, First Student, Glenbard School District has launched FirstView[®], a bus tracking and parent communications app for your smartphone or desktop. The app is now live and includes the following features:

Live Tracking

The FirstView[®] map screen shows you the live location and direction of your student's bus, your student's stop schedule for the current day and timestamps for school arrivals and departures. You'll know when the bus gets to school in the morning and leaves in the afternoon!

Predictive Stop Arrival Times

Analyzing route and real-time GPS data, it determines an estimated time of arrival to your stop provided on the FirstView[®] map.

Custom Alerts and Messages

Set up push or email notifications alerting you when your student's bus is a chosen distance or number of minutes away from your stop.

Multi-Stop View

Buses for all your students can be tracked with FirstView[®]. Using individual colors for each student, every selected stop appears on the map simultaneously for easy viewing.

Additional User Notifications

Connect up to three additional email accounts to receive email alerts. This is a great feature for grandparents or caregivers!

Available in French & Spanish

Secure and Easy Access

FirstView[®] requires a password-protected account for app set-up. This way, only you can view your student's stop!

Safety is always our top priority

We value the trust you place in us to care for the most important people in your life - your children - and we take many steps to keep students safe while they are at school.

Within the past year, we developed a comprehensive Emergency Operations Plan, based on the Federal Emergency Management Association's National Incident Management System (NIMS) structure. Emergency procedures have been in place, but our Emergency Operations Plan provides more structure and clarity.

Let's look at some of our safety measures:

- Our faculty and staff have fostered relationships with our students, providing students a trusted adult to talk with.
- Our student services team works with students to help them through challenges and monitors our students' well-being.
- We comply with drills required by the state, including drills related to fire, severe weather, lockdown and evacuation.
- As part of our partnership with emergency responders, each year, we meet with police and fire agencies from throughout our district to discuss safety issues.
- Emergency responders train in our schools.
- We have a school resource officer at school, and a marked police vehicle on campus.
- Our school security team monitors the building and grounds, both in person and via surveillance camera.
- We have a secured vestibule that is manned by security staff members.
- All visitors are screened at the main entrance and must provide a driver's license, which is scanned through a background database.
- Staff members wear name tags and ID lanyards, and all students carry a student ID.
- Exterior lighting has been improved.
- As part of tabletop drills conducted with safety consultants, our staff rehearse procedures and react to a crisis simulation.
- We've extended the hours of campus security staff.

Our district-wide Safety Security Committee reviews each school's plans to ensure they are current and being implemented. We continually review our emergency procedures and study best practice related to school safety.

Our students know it is their responsibility to talk to an adult if they ever feel there is a threat to our safety. I am proud of our students and staff for taking seriously our No. 1 priority: the safety of those in our care at school.



Senior Portrait Make-Up Dates:

Students must make their appointments either by phone or on-line through Prestige. If they have any problems setting up an appointment, students may call Prestige at 630-910-6800 ext. #5 for assistance. Walk-ins without appointments for senior portraits are not available. IF students cannot make any of the Glenbard dates we've scheduled, they may use the same phone number to arrange a senior photo at the Prestige's studio location instead. Ingrid has sent out the Prestige post cards listing this same information to seniors who have not yet taken a senior portrait.
