Can you imagine sitting for a 3 ½ hour exam and never seeing your result? It is essential for every student to have a college board account. This allows students to view their PSAT, SAT, and AP exam results, link their accounts to Khan Academy to prep for exams, and register for any SAT exams that they would like to take outside the district.

All freshman will be setting up their accounts in their math classes, all other students should have set up an account last year. Glenbard North's Commencement Ceremony will take place on **Thursday, May 23, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.** We will hold rehearsal for all graduates before the ceremony from 5:00 p.m.-6:00 p.m. Both the rehearsal and the graduation ceremony will take place in the Physical Education Building at the College of DuPage.

Each graduate will receive <u>six tickets</u> to share with family members as he/she sees fit. If additional tickets are needed, please talk with fellow graduates and/or their families as they may have tickets that they will not use. Morning Drop-off

Dropping your child off in the morning can be a challenge at times due to traffic and weather conditions. Our bus drop-off lot on Kuhn Road accommodates our 16 buses and more than 300 vehicles each morning. Be sure to respect the lanes created to keep traffic organized, as well as Andy Frain personnel helping to direct traffic. On days when it snows or the temperature is very low, greater delays are inevitable. The one thing that you can control each day is the time you leave. Plan to leave earlier than normal on days when you know weather will slow things down. Keep in mind that our busiest time is 7:20-7:30 and arriving before that can make a tremendous difference.

Regardless of the weather or any delays you may encounter, always keep in mind that the most important thing is our students' safety. Do not do anything to create a dangerous environment for our students. Always drive slowly through the lot and be aware of students exiting vehicles and walking across the lot to the building. Thank you for all you do to help maintain a drop-off process that is as safe and efficient as possible.

Although we are just beginning second semester, we already also planning for the 2019-20 school year. Mark your calendars for Back-to-School Week which will take place the week of August 5th. This includes iPad training for freshmen, and schedule pick up and ID pictures for all students. Last month, we held our first meeting with our Profile of a Graduate Committee -- a group of more than

60 students, parents, community members, teachers, administrators and Board of Education members. Their energy and feedback were overwhelmingly positive.

Committee members participated in several activities to learn more about graduate profiles and recent trends in the workforce and society. They also started building consensus on what our Profile of a Graduate will look like.

A Profile of a Graduate is a collection of capabilities or qualities that characterize our graduates. We're working with<u>EdLeader21</u> to identify the knowledge, skills and experiences our students must gain in high school so they are prepared for college, careers and life.

Our Profile of a Graduate will guide our work to prepare students for their future in a changing world. It will help answer:

- What should our graduates be able to do?
- What should they know?
- What are they ready to do?
- How will they view themselves?

During the Profile of a Graduate Committee's first meeting, we reviewed the ThoughtExchange report, which outlines the ideas and trends from our community-wide survey conducted in November. Our Thoughtexchange asked people to answer two open-ended questions and rate other people's comments through a star rating system. We appreciate so many people taking time to share their thoughts and opinions. There were more than 32,000 ratings of the 1,413 thoughts shared in our Thoughtexchange. PARENTS OF JUNIORS - PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE



Students entering grade 12 in the State of Illinois must be immunized for Meningitis. The immunization requirement consists of two doses of the MCV4 vaccine for entry into 12th grade. The first dose is given on or after your child's 11th birthday, and the second dose on or after your child's 16th birthday. Only one dose of the MCV4 is required for students entering 12th grade if the first dose was received on/after the age of 16.

If your student is 16 years of age please make an appointment to get their meningococcal vaccination. Proof of immunization can be turned into the nurses office as soon as your child receives their shot.

We ask that proof of vaccination be turned in by May 1st, 2019. If it is not received by the first week of August your child will not be able to get their parking pass, school ID, or participate in back to school week.
