Other Information:

Students can reschedule a Day 1 or Day 2 exam. Only students who have three written exams on Day 1 or 2 may choose to reschedule one of those exams based on the following criteria:  
Student presents a compelling educational rationale to the teacher in advance  
Student has obtained approval from the teacher by the end of the day on December 13th.  
Students who reschedule a period 5, 6, 7 or 8 exam are required to report to the classroom during that time unless a parent calls the attendance office to excuse them.  
Students who reschedule a period 2 or 3 exam must still report to that classroom for attendance. The classroom teacher may then write a pass to the library or the cafeteria for study hall.  
Activities and athletic practices start at 1:15 p.m. each day. Students must report to the cafeteria if waiting on campus for practice/activities to begin.

### **A Message from the Assistant Principal for Student Services**

#### **Security Plan - Final Exams and Assessments**

As with many high-stakes, uniquely generated assessments, security is a high priority. When the assessment is compromised it is difficult to determine the validity of the results for all students that have worked hard to prepare and produce.

Following the lead from our national partners like College Board (SAT, AP), ACT and, Glenbard North High School has made a move to significantly increase the security of our Final Exams. These procedures were put into place during the 2017-2018 school year and will be in effect during this year also.

Our national partners have a strict, highly-visible policy that prohibits cell phones and other camera-enabled and memory storage devices (including smart watches) into the testing environment. Beginning this school year, Glenbard North High School is adopting this same policy for our final exams and district-wide assessments.

During Final Exams and District-Wide Assessments, students will not be permitted to bring cell phones into the classroom during any portion of a final exam. Students may be permitted to bring their iPad and/or calculator if given permission from the teacher. Students may never take pictures or record information from Final Exams or District Wide Assessments. Similar to the other high-stakes assessments, the consequences for bringing these types of devices into the testing environment may be significant such as receiving zero for the assessment and accompanying Academic Dishonesty disciplinary consequences.

It is recommended that students choose to leave these devices in their locker or leave them at home for the day.

Note: For the purposes of this plan, "cell phones and other camera-enabled devices" include, but are not limited to: all cellular telephones, digital and non-digital cameras, camera or cellular enabled watches or computing devices.

This year's Graduation Ceremony will take place on Friday, May 22, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. We will hold rehearsal for all graduates before the ceremony from 5:00 p.m.-6:00 p.m. Both the rehearsal and the graduation ceremony will take place in the Physical Education Building at the College of DuPage.

Each graduate will receive **six tickets** to share with family members as he/she sees fit. If additional tickets are needed, please talk with fellow graduates and/or their families as they may have tickets that they will not use. #### **Morning Drop-off**

Dropping your child off in the morning can be a challenge at times due to high traffic volume and weather conditions. Our bus drop-off lot on Kuhn accommodates our 16 buses and more than 300 vehicles daily, but thanks to each of you, traffic has flowed well. As you know, the lot is divided by cones into three lanes, with the lane closest to the school specifically for buses. Once all buses are through, we may open this lane to other vehicles. I ask that you continue to respect the lanes created to keep traffic organized, as well as Andy Frain personnel helping to direct traffic. On days when it snows or the temperature is very low, greater delays are inevitable. The one thing that you can control each day is the time you leave. Plan to leave earlier than normal on days when you know the weather



will slow things down. Keep in mind that our busiest time is 7:20-7:30 and arriving before that can make a tremendous difference.

Regardless of the weather or any delays you may encounter, always keep in mind that the most important thing is our students' safety. Do not do anything to create a dangerous environment for our students. Always drive slowly through the lot and be aware of students exiting vehicles and walking across the lot to the building. Thank you for all you do to help maintain a drop-off process that is as safe and efficient as possible.

GBN is hosting an AP Information night on Wednesday night, starting at 6:30 pm. Our department chairs will share AP offerings (we have 25 AP courses to select from) and your questions will be answered about AP classes, testing, and the benefits and struggles entailed with taking an AP Course.

**\*Illinois Science Assessment:** This is a new assessment for juniors and is a comprehensive science assessment with topics pulled from biology, chemistry, and physics. We are still

determining the best testing environment for students to take this 3- hour exam.

**\*\* SAT Pre-Administration:** Juniors will fill out the demographic portion of their SAT Answer Sheet. They can designate 3 colleges or universities to send their scores to free of charge.

**\*\*\* P/SAT Suite of Assessments:** No pre-registration necessary. The school day (not weekend) administration of the SAT is a state graduation requirement for all seniors earning a diploma in Illinois.

**Tip for Juniors:** Take the SAT/Act multiple times to achieve your best score.

**Free SAT Prep Classes - Juniors:** District #87 is offering an SAT Prep Class starting 2nd semester and leading up to the April 14 SAT exam. This 10-week course will meet on Tuesdays from 2:45 - 5:30 pm, or from 5:45 pm-8:30 pm starting January 28. ***Academic Approach***, a company with a strong record of growing student scores on the SAT, will provide instruction. This is a big commitment, but we feel this will provide your student with optimal preparation for the SAT. Please click on the link below to register. 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## School Counseling

Our School Counseling Department is excited to begin the course enrollment process for the 2020-21 school year. Students will enter their course requests online in the student portal of PowerSchool. Students who have an IEP or who receive academic support within the ELL program will have access to view their course selections.

It is essential that your student give careful consideration to his/her course choices. Any changes past February 1st, 2020 must be discussed with the student's school counselor prior to April 30th, 2020 and are subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed. **Students may not change their mind after April 30, 2020.** Parents, we value your input in this process because you best understand your own student's interests and goals. Please note the following important enrollment dates:

**December 2nd - December 6th (Curriculum Advisement Week):** Teachers have one-on-one verbal conversations with each student regarding their recommended courses for next year (2020-21).

**December 2 (Counselors provide enrollment information):** Counselors visit all freshman, sophomore, and junior English classes to deliver online course enrollment information. Students will learn how to enter their courses in PowerSchool for the 2020-21 school year.

**December 2 - January 6: Student Online Enrollment OPEN**

Students and parents will have from December 2nd, 2019 - January 6th, 2020 to input course requests in the student portal of PowerSchool. Please see the Guidelines for Course Enrollment Sheet for helpful enrollment tips.

**January 6, 2020:** Student Online Enrollment **CLOSED**

**January 9- 27, 2020: (Individual follow-up meetings)**

School counselors will have an individual follow-up meeting with students to review and finalize courses between January 9th and February 1st, 2020.

**April 30th, 2020: Last day to change a course for the 2020-21 school year**

Students are encouraged to "speak up" and tell an adult in the school when they feel uncomfortable or witness inappropriate behaviors such as bullying. If a situation is reported, the administration will investigate the claim, assess its validity and handle it accordingly.

#### Latex Allergies

Latex balloons or products containing latex pose a significant health threat to students with latex allergies. These products are **NOT ALLOWED** on campus at any time, including after school, evening or weekend events.
