



*Illinois Science Assessment (Juniors): This is a new assessment for juniors and is a comprehensive science assessment with topics pulled from biology, chemistry, and physics. This is a 3-hour exam administered to all Juniors on their iPads.

^{**} SAT Pre-Administration (Juniors): Juniors will fill out the demographic portion of their SAT

Answer Sheet. They can designate 3 colleges or universities to send their scores to free of charge.

*** **P/SAT Suite of Assessments:** No pre-registration necessary. The school day (not weekend) administration of the SAT is a state graduation requirement for all seniors earning a diploma in Illinois.

A message from the Superintendent

Creates is a key competency in our Profile of a Graduate

In the past few newsletters, I've shared with you information about our Profile of a Graduate, which features six competencies we want every graduate to embody:

A Glenbard Graduate:

- Collaborates
- Communicates
- Thinks Critically
- Embraces Diversity
- Creates
- Is Self-Empowered

Today, let's look at the competency of creates. We want our students to have opportunities to create in the traditional sense - music, writing and art. We also want them to have the chance to create podcasts and videos, as well as create solutions to real problems in the world. We want to empower them to generate original ideas, solutions and products.

Classroom Example

As an example of what this competency looks like in the classroom, sophomores learning about satire in an English class created commercials and public service announcements. They used green screen, Filmmaker Pro, teleprompter app, Schoology and their knowledge of satirical devices to create a product that required them to assess, evaluate and portray characters from a text they read.

Competency Descriptions

The competencies in our Profile of a Graduate are accompanied by descriptions that were developed by department chairs from each of our schools, along with school and district administrators. We worked through several iterations and used resources from EdLeader21, a national network of educators implementing competencies into their systems.

The following are the descriptions that accompany creates:

 Solves real problems that are passion and purpose driven, in local community and around the world


- Generates original ideas, solutions and products in imaginative ways

ATTENTION JUNIORS



PARENTS OF JUNIORS - PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE

Students entering grade 12 in the State of Illinois must be **immunized** for Meningitis. The immunization requirement consists of two doses of the MCV4 vaccine for entry into 12th grade. The first dose is given on or after your child's 11th birthday, and the second dose on or after your child's 16th birthday. Only one dose of the MCV4 is required for students entering 12th grade if the first dose was received on/after the age of 16.

If your student is 16 years of age please make an appointment to get their meningococcal vaccination. Proof of immunization can be turned into the nurses office as soon as your child receives their shot.

We ask that proof of vaccination be **turned in by May 1st, 2020**. If it is not received by the first week of August, your child will not be able to get their parking pass, school ID, or participate in back to school week.

No parking pass or school ID for fall until we receive proof of vaccination



How to be sure you receive messages about school closings and more

To be sure your receive automated messages from Glenbard, watch this video to see how to add an email address & phone number that will receive mass-communications from your student's high school. Note: the video does not have sound. We will send an automated message for emergency school closing, important testing information and more. Certain fields in PowerSchool must be populated in order to receive automated messages from us.

- 1. Login to PowerSchool at ps.glenbard.org
- 2. Click "Student Info" on the left-hand column
- 3. Scroll down the page to the "Glenbard Notification Information" area
- 4. Add your information and check the "I authorize the above statement" box in the large





Self-Identification Options and Accommodations

Warning and Affirmation

Illinois law has made it a crime, punishable by imprisonment and fine, to knowingly or willfully present any false information regarding residency of a student for the purpose of enabling that student to attend on a tuition-free basis or to knowingly enroll a student on a tuition-free basis when the student is known to be a non-resident of the District. The District will seek prosecution to the full extent of the law on any persons that District believes has committed any residency-related crime. Additionally, a civil lawsuit may be initiated by the District.
