A Message from the Assistant Principal for Instruction

Final Exams

Due to our rapidly evolving circumstances during this pandemic, we have had to adjust instruction to better meet the needs of our students. Teachers across the district have been given the autonomy to make those instructional decisions, which may look different from course to course. This requires us to also be adaptive on how we assess student learning.

The end of the semester is usually reserved for Final Exam days and the schedule adjusted accordingly. However, the instructional adjustments teachers made this semester have resulted in the need to adapt these assessments as well. As a result, Glenbard District 87 will not have a traditional final exam schedule. Instead, we will follow the schedule below, and your student may encounter a variety of assessment experiences ranging from a final exam, a unit summative assessment or a culminating project. Teachers will communicate how first semester grades will be finalized.

We are very proud of our students and how they rose up to the learning challenges this semester. If you or your student have any questions, feel free to reach out to your student's teachers.

Spring Assessments:

- January Access Testing ELL Students on iPad: This test measures a student proficiency in reading, writing, listening and speaking. It is used to evaluate student progress, place students in classes, and to dismiss students form ELL Services.
- March Illinois Science Assessment Junior Class on iPad: This assessment measures a student's knowledge of biology, chemistry and physics.
- April 13 SAT Junior Class paper based test : This state sponsored exam is both a graduation requirement and a college admissions exam. Any senior who has not taken the school day SAT will take the exam on this date as well. Students do not need to register for this exam.
- April 14 PSAT 8/9 Frosh, PSAT 10 Sophs paper based test : These exams are used to gauge a student's growth towards proficiency on the SAT.
- May 3-14: AP Testing: During a two-week window we administer AP tests to enrolled students. College Board has assured us that these will be administered on Paper this year.

New Courses to be Offered Next Year:

- African American Experiences with Literature Senior 1 Semester Elective: This course is designed for anyone with a strong appetite for reading, a dedication to respectful discussion, and desire for personal growth around race and equity in our society.
- **Principles of Engineering Project Lead the Way Full Year Course:** This course is the 2nd course in a sequence of engineering courses offered via Project Lead the Way a nationwide engineering curriculum.
- Online Wellness Jr/Sr Semester/repeatable course: This course allows students to create, monitor, and adapt fitness plans asynchronously. Students will be issued Polar Heart Rate Monitors

and will primarily engage with their teacher remotely.

- Mathematics 1218 <u>Dual Credit</u> SR full year: This math course mimics the 1st year math course offered at College of DuPage and is designed for students pursuing non-Stem majors. A pre-requisite for this course is a 530 on the mathematics portion of the SAT. Students will earn 6 college credit hours that can be transferred to any university.
- Spanish 2H/Italian 4: These two courses have been added to our world language sequence of courses next year.

A Message from the Assistant Principal for Athletics

We would like to congratulate all of our fall athletes on the completion of their season. Glenbard North had multiple athletes qualify for DKC All-Conference. Congratulations to Brooke Westra and Nicole McGuire in Girls Golf, Grace Schager in Girls Cross Country, Julliana Boyle and Ella Witteveen in Girls Swimming, and Sophie Raval and Sage Hills in Girls Tennis.

We would also like to congratulate our IHSA sectional qualifiers; Grace Schager in Girls Cross Country, Daniel Gallegos in Boys Cross Country, and Sage Hills in Girls Tennis. Grace Schager finished 27th in the sectional to qualify for the IHSA state finals. For Sage Hills this was her fourth year as a IHSA state qualifier.

On November 17th, we received information from Governor Pritzker and the Illinois State Board of Education regarding our winter sports season. According to this communication, all indoor sports are being put on hold as of Friday, November 20th. Our winter sports practices are now paused as well as all in-person athletic practices and activities until we receive further information.

The Tier 3 Resurgence Mitigations do address organized group recreational activities (sports, indoor sports and activity facilities, etc.), which include school-based activities. The mitigations pause all indoor group sporting and recreational activities, including youth and adult recreational sports, park districts, and travel leagues, and require the closure of locker rooms.

Glenbard North High School, our Athletic Department, and our Coaches are dedicated to doing everything we can to help our athletes have a safe and successful school year. We understand the importance of athletics and the impact it can have on our athletes.

We understand that this is a difficult time for our athletes. Many of them have worked so hard for this opportunity. If there is anything we can do please reach out to myself or any of our coaches if we can do anything to help.

A message from the Superintendent

Superintendent discusses quality, equitable instruction

I am confident in both our hybrid model and our fully remote learning models, which were designed to adapt to the circumstances of the incidence of COVID-19 in our community. When we need to shift from one model to the other, we will maintain the same schedule and quality instruction.

While our learning environment might change, we are focused on a quality learning experience for our students whether they are in person or learning remotely. Teachers are livestreaming their lessons and providing instruction and assistance five days a week.

School looks different these days, but some things remain the same - our exceptional faculty and staff's commitment to the success of each student and their genuine care and concern for every student. Whether we are in a fully remote or hybrid model, be assured our student-centered staff is connecting with students, offering support with academic and social-emotional matters alike.

During our hybrid model, our teachers developed instructional strategies that apply to the students in front of them in the classroom, as well as those learning remotely. They used practices that kept both the hybrid model and the fully remote model equitable.

Teachers continued to use Schoology to post and collect assignments. They used tools such as online whiteboards for instruction so all students could clearly see the materials.

Teachers are providing support for students both during class time and during teachers' office hours. Our teachers understand that students will have questions, and they are ready to help each student with the content, along with other issues students are facing. Under extraordinary circumstances, they show up every day focused on helping students prepare for the future they choose.
